#### **IPM** statement

It is the goal of Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Preschool to implement IPM by focusing on long-term prevention or suppression of pests through accurate pest identification, by frequent monitoring for pest presence, by applying appropriate action levels, and by making the habitat less conducive to pests using sanitation and mechanical and physical controls. Pesticides that are effective will be used in a manner that minimizes risks to people, property, and the environment, and only after other options have been shown ineffective.

Our pest management objectives are to: (Example: Focus on long-term pest prevention)

- 1. Keep spider webs cleared inside & out
- Keep areas clear of clutter
  Have Lids on trash cans & wipe them down daily.
- 4. Seal cracks & doors
- 5. Use a bleach & water solution to disinfect & sanitize daily
